Dr. Gurevich,

I asked my royalties supervisor, Christin Harrington, to prepare this detailed spreadsheet of all the royalty statements (including the history of royalties paid pre-TF by Marcell Dekker). I asked her to compare this to the information which was summarized to you in a September email by a newer member of our royalty staff. I did not have a way to reconcile to your recap of the royalty statements but hopefully you will be able to verify your information against this spreadsheet and get back to me with questions.

During this review the most significant items noted were:

- Our email update to you also included the Marcel Dekker sales – which were pre T&F statements
- Our online system used by the staff in their recap includes short term rentals as units – but we don't count these as units in our royalty statements for e-books
- There are some "post royalty statement" 2019 sales that were included in the royalty staff email that are not yet showing up on statements.

You will see a couple of difference is units where our staff indicated it is less than per the statements that Christin in following up on but I wanted to get back to you as soon as possible with this detail. Please let me know if there is anything else you need her to focus on and again sorry for the frustrations this lack of clarity has caused.

Mr. Emmett,

Yes, you're right, I was very disappointed with the lack of clarity in your replay.

Let's try to clarify. There is data sent to me by your royalty department (Mr. Stephen Kruszewski) and there is data on royalties paid to me over 15 years. The difference between these two documents is 925 copies sold. Such a big difference cannot be explained by a simple error or lack of consideration of some copies of the book.

Unfortunately, I still have not received any explanation about such a big difference that it only strengthens the suspicion of the desire to hide the truth behind long and confused reasoning.

I repeat once again: between the sales data and the data on the royalties paid to me there is a difference of \$ 6,660. I ask you to return this amount to me. Please answer me clearly whether you intend to return this amount to me? This is a very simple question to which I would like to get the same simple answer instead of the complicated and confusing tables sent to me.
